Dear Mr Johnson,

We are writing to you to complain in the strongest possible terms about the web site www.killergram.com.

The site displays a Union Jack on its home page and claims to be "The British Premier Hardcore Network". However, the site is plainly operating illegally in that it displays (a great deal of) TV quality and TV-like hardcore pornographic material on web pages which are easily accessible to anyone and everyone, there being no discernible age verification mechanism in place, nor any other form of obstacle to access. There is a message on the home page about age requirements but this acts more as a "come on" than a deterrent and therefore in no sense is it an adequate alternative to having a robust means of barring access to legal minors.

We are astonished that the Police and Crown Prosecution Service have not acted against this site but perhaps there is something ATVOD can do to secure compliance with our laws?
